ANNUAL REPORT 2012

Overall Hahndorf Soccer Club had a very busy 2012 season both on and off the pitch. Facilities were improved on and all players strove to be the best.

With a constant turn over of players throughout the three senior teams, they were not able to secure their place in Division 2 of the SAASL. The Juniors on the other hand improved throughout the season, with many teams finishing first or second in the AHJSA league or Cup competitions.

The installation of power to the shed and changerooms now allows the canteen to be a more user friendly facility.



Annual Report 2012

Committee

The Committee had an early change with Stuart Thomas resigning as Chairperson and Vice Chair Daniel Mardle filling in for the remainder of the season. He was joined by other committee members - Anita Kerr (Secretary/Registrar), Donna Thomas (Treasurer), James Kerr (Coaching Co-ordinator), Graham Phillips (Facilities), Suzanne Fuzzard, with the assistance by Natasha Kuller, (Canteen), Jill Millhouse (Equipment) and Jim Kell for monthly meetings to manage the club.

- Senior Registrar - 62 players were registered with the SAASL, many playing on a casual basis. The A's and B's competed in Saturday Division 2, while the C Team was in Division 7. Fortunately this meant the fixtures allowed all three senior teams to play at Home on the same day.
- Junior Registrar - 105 children were registered with the AHJSA, ranging from Under 8 to Under 16. We were unable to field an U17G team. The club also had 18 4-7 year olds participating in our Development Squad program.
- Coaching Co-ordinator - liaised with the coaches on training times and locations. Several new coaches were also able to attend a coaching "Grass Roots" course organized by the AHJSA.
- Facilities - There were several members that worked tirelessly before the season started to connect power to our shed. This gave us lighting to the changerooms and verandah area. Plus the canteen became more user friendly with fridge, kettle, pie warmer, etc installed. Games were played every Saturday at Pine Avenue, even during the wettest months of July and August. The Club continued to utilize the Mylor oval as a training location.

- Canteen - This season we trialed having paid staff at senior Home games, but continued having parent volunteers when the juniors were playing. Both systems worked well and the canteen remained one of our major income earners for the season. With power installed we were able to offer a wider range of stock.
- Equipment - Prior to the start of the season the Club upgraded the Net wall at the eastern end of the pitch. Training balls were pooled together for all teams to utilize, plus individual equipment (shirts, bibs, first aid kit) was given to each team. A new "fluro yellow" number was trialed on the U12G shirts.
- Social - The Club celebrated the installation of the power with a barbeque/bonfire night in May. Junior teams attended dinner nights at the Hahndorf Inn and the senior teams had their Presentation there. The younger junior teams had a Presentation sausage sizzle at the shed and the competitive teams celebrated with a catered meal in the Oval Clubrooms.
- Communications - The website is constantly updated allowing for members to be well informed. The Facebook page, is an avenue for all seniors to keep up-to-date. Junior Team Managers remain essential for the perpetual stream of information to be passed onto players and parents.
- Grants and Sponsorship - The Club was successful in obtaining funding from the Hahndorf Community Hall group. These funds will go towards completing work on the shed/changerooms. The Hahndorf Inn continued to support the Club with financial sponsorship. The IGA and Noske also gave generous discounts when we purchased stock locally.
- Merchandise - Stock that was carried over from last year sold throughout the season. Seniors continued to purchase merchandise independently from the Club.

Coaches

Steve Handley remained Coach of the "A" Team and became a playing coach to the "C" Team. He was ably assisted by Mark McGrath, who took control of the "B" Team. Bob McIntyre continued in a supporting role to all of the Senior teams. The Junior Coaches were: U16 - James Kerr, U14G - Simon Blake and David Allanson, U14 - Graham Phillips, U12G - Ron Smith, U12 - Ashley Parr, U10 - Daniel Mardle, U9 Dave Riches, U8 (Black and White) Graham Phillips, with Jim Kell assisting on Saturdays and Daniel Mardle taking the Development Squad training program on Wednesdays.

Senior Teams

The Senior Teams struggled with an always changing line up of players in each of the three teams. The "A" Team finished in last spot, while the B's finished 7th. The "C" Team finished 4th in their division. Unfortunately these results will mean the A's and B's will drop to Division 3 and make it almost impossible to have all three teams playing at Home together in 2013.

Junior Teams

Hahndorf was very successful this season having the U16s win their Cup final (played at Anembo Park on a Friday night), along with the U14 and U14G teams winning their respective leagues and the U12s finishing runners up. Hahndorf U14G player Georgia Townsend was awarded the competitions Best and Fairest runners up at the AHJSA awards night. All of the non-competitive teams showed great sportsmanship and enthusiasm.
