# Annual Report 2018

The 2018 Hahndorf Soccer Club Committee consisted of Graham Phillips (Chairman/Grounds/Facilities), Anita Kerr (Secretary/Registrar), Daniel Mardle (Treasurer), Claudia Kerr (Coaching Director), Jeremy Hack (Equipment), Mel Stapleton (Merchandise), Steve Shotton (Sponsorship), Mark deLange (AHJSA Delegate), Vicki McCleary (Canteen), Narelle Hardingham (Junior Co-ordinator) and Dean Bagley (Marketing/Media); with assistance from Susie Kell (Website), Olivia Mardle (Child Safe Officer), Mel Schwarz (non-comp co-ord) and Diana Frangiosa (Girls co-ord).

The Committee met once a month to manage the running of the club. Details below outline some of the work that was undertaken throughout the year:

- Players Registered - Hahndorf had 10 miniroos (4-6 year olds), 64 non-competitive players (7-10 years olds) and 107 competitive players (10-17 year olds) register this season. We had three U8, two U9, an U10, two U12, two U13G, an U14, U16 and U17G teams nominated with the AHJSA, making us the largest junior club in the Hills. The Club had three senior men's teams (46 players registered) and one women's team (18 players registered, including several girls from our U17G team, plus 4 'Guest' players).
- Facilities/Grounds - General maintenance continued throughout the year with watering, lawn mowing, brush cutting, rolling the pitch and cleaning the facilities weekly. Line marking was maintained for Pine Ave and St Michaels School. Our main pitch suffered this season due to the underground drains not flowing freely. Work on the drainage outlets and clearing of the northern bank from undergrowth and blackberries has been ongoing. Watering by the

large (manual) sprinkler and hoses is to be replaced by an underground irrigation system, over coming months, funded by Office Rec and Sport and Mt Barker Council.

The Home and Away changerooms, along with the referee room and public toilet were painted for the start of the 2018, with flooring to be completed before start of the 2019 season. Mylor Oval, Heathfield HS gym and the Hahndorf Primary School gym were hired for training purposes.

- Coaches - All Club coaches were accredited and supported in their endeavors to obtain further qualifications. Club coaches were: James Kerr, Chris Lennon and Graham Phillips - assisted by Jason Brinkworth and Scott Ayris (senior men), James Kerr (women), David Peacock (U17G), Callan Marshall-Hart and Jess Kim (U16), Dean Bagley (U14), Enzo Dama and Richard Epstein (U13G), Chris Pfitzner and Graham Phillips (U12), Ben Dahmke and Clinton Oliver (U10), Steve Shotton and Darcy Mardle (U9), Tim Verryt, Eddie Hardingham and the Beesleys (U8) and Martin Moran (miniroos). The coaches were assisted each week with dedicated team managers, who managed all the paperwork to ensure players could take the field. New guidelines were produced to assist with the game preparation of the grounds/facilities.
- Equipment - Several new sets of junior shirts were purchased, along with balls, cones and other training equipment. Three kits of yellow 'alternative strip' shirts were purchased for the men's teams - with funding coming from the Government. New goalie shirts, with club logo, were ordered and will be rolled out for the 2019 season.
- Merchandise - We continued to stock a range of merchandise, allowing members to purchase directly from the club.
- Publicity/Media - The Club designed a new website to promote a fresher look and provide relevant information. The Club's 'Information Booklet' was updated and a comprehensive booklet was formulated to support all Team Managers. Photos and match reports were sent into the local paper promoting Hahndorf to the wide community.

Our Facebook page also promotes the sport and club's functions/events to the wider community and provides access for club members to keep in touch.

- Canteen - Finally the Club obtained a restricted 'Club License' which meant we didn't have to apply for a liquor license each week when the senior teams were playing at Home. The Club obtained the Level 3 Good Sports Accreditation developing several new policies promoting a safe and enjoyable environment for all members. We also purchased a new 'glass door' display fridge for the canteen.
- Senior Teams - 2018 saw an important step of aligning football in the state as the SAASL affiliated with FFSA. Our men's teams are affiliated with the SAASL and participated in the Saturday Division 3 competition - As and Bs, plus Division 7. The As and Bs finished 5th and 4th respectively and the Cs finished 9th. With injuries and absences the Cs were forced to forfeit several games. The women's team played in the FFSA Community League, Division 4 and finished 6th. The senior women were well supported by many U17Gs looking for a challenge and an extra game.
- Juniors - Non-competitive games were played at Pine Ave and St Michaels and were fortunate to not have many games cancelled due to the weather. No results are recorded, as the main aim of this age group is to enjoy the sport. The girls teams performed well finishing 1st (U13GW) and 2nd (U13GB) in the league competition and the Blacks winning the Cup. The U17G team finished 3rd overall.
